2017 MYSTERY QUILT January - Clue 1



To start, you will need 20 Fat Quarters and 8 Ziploc bags labeled A through H. Divide the fat quarters into piles of 10 light and 10 medium/dark.



From each medium/dark fat quarter cut 13 - 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips. You need a total of 124 strips. Put 93 in a baggie labeled "A" and the remaining 31 in another baggie labeled "B".



From each light fat quarter cut 11 - 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips. You need a total of 105 strips. Put 93 in a bag labeled "C" and the remaining in bag labeled "D".

From the remaining pieces of the light fat quarters cut:

- (12) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" squares put in bag E
- (12) 2 1/2"x 4 1/2" rectangles put in bag labeled F
- (12) 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles put in bag labeled G
- (7) 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips put in bag labeled H

souri Star pattern called "Love Notes". If interested in this project you will need a variety of 5 inch squares of red and white fabric, basic sewing supplies, sewing machine and rotary cutter, mat and ruler.

## **Community Service**

Collected at the January meeting were 47 eye glass cases and 15 baby hats = Lehigh Valley Hospital, 6 angel gowns = Reading Hospital.

**March** - 30 laundry bags for Reading Children's Home.

**July** - Fidget Quilts for Reading Hospital NO button, NO beads, NO metal rings. Yes -ribbons, zippers, yo yos and different textures. Flannel backing so it won't slide off the lap. Size 12"x12" to 24"x24".

**Fall** - Lap Quilts for adults and children given at cancer treatment center at Lehigh Valley Hospital. Baby quilts for Nurse Family Partnership in Reading.

Also collected at each meeting, canceled stamps, Christmas stockings, shampoos, hand lotions etc. and money for our military personnel

Reading Hospital is again asking for abdominal pillows 10" x 27". Stuffing will be provided. Call Cathy Phillips @ 610-926-1520 for stuffing.

St. Joseph's Hospital is requesting monitor bags approx.  $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x6". Cut fabric 14" x 5"". Fold in half and surge (sew) up the 2 sides.

Hem the top 1/2" down, put 27" cut strap into hem 2 1/4" apart and then top stitch in place.

Twill tape for the strap will be provided.

## Directions for laundry bags

One yard of masculine or solid sturdy fabric (prewashed). Cut off 6" x width of fabric for cord casing. Cut this in half (about 20-22"), hem the short ends, Fold the 30" x 42" fabric in half (30x21) and sew the seam and bottom edge. (This is like a pillow case) Sew the 2 casings to the top. **Cord will be provided by the guild.**

Audit Committee/Budget Committee: The Audit Committee reported records are in very good order. They had a few recommendations for more detailed fundraising activity reporting.












After pressing, the top of E will extend over the C/G/C unit.

The Hummelstown Area Historical Society is partnering with the PieceMakers Quilt Guild of Middletown to present a special Quilt Show. Seventy five vintage and contemporary quilts will be displayed at the Society's historic 1815 Parish House at North Rosanna Street and North Alley in Hummelstown.

The Show is open from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM on five consecutive Sundays between January 29 and February 26, 2017. There is no charge for admission.

The Show, entitled Quilt 2, is a follow-up to one that the Society organized as part of Hummelstown's 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2012. Quilt 2 will feature new displays including:

- O A Then and Now display of quilts sewn in different time periods but with the same pattern.
- O Four Star of Bethlehem Quilts are featured, dating from 1880 to 1950.
- O Crib and Cradle Quilts displayed on doll and children's furniture.
- O A Quilter's Showcase features a series of 5 quilts sewn by a single quilter.
- O A WOW display of quilts which are breathtaking in design, craftsmanship, or color.
- O Vintage quilts from the Society's collection. I have included a photograph of a Broken Dishes Quilt.

This Show is not to be missed by those who enjoy sewing quilts, admiring quilts, or appreciating the history and artistry associated with quilts.
